MASKS, TEMPERATURE CHECKS, AND SANITIZER ARE REQUIRED FOR ENTRY only Adult Client, or Minor Child and one Parent may enter the clinic.

No additional friends, family, or children allowed.

There may be times, due to inclement weather, or other extenuating circumstances that a walk-in clinic might be closed - this will be posted on clinic entrance doors.

The SDA Walk-In Clinic serves individuals on a limited, first come, first-served basis.

Our Medication Providers typically DO NOT see individuals on the same day of the SDA Walk-In Clinic

For Behavioral Health or Medical Emergencies, please call 911 or visit your local emergency room.

Adults who are referred for assessment/evaluation by the Department of Social Services(DSS) will not be seen at the SDA Walk-in Clinics. Anyone referred by DSS, Court, Probation or Parole, or ASAP must have referral faxed by referring agency prior to assessment with reason for referral AND relevant background information.
